Walk down any streets in the world and you will see young people holding smartphones to their ears, sending text messages or logging on to Facebook. Companies around the world are reacting to the daily habits of young people and sending their ads where their customers are online.

Levi Strauss, the American jeans maker, discovered a new way to reach its Asian customers through advertising. He chose 20-year-old teenagers being from Singapore, Hong Kong, Korea, and India to spread the world about his clothes. One of those ad carriers is a girl called Bright, a writer and blogger from India. She talks about the clothes on the internet and answer questions from her friends. According to Bright, they want to know more about the products and trust her judgement more than a commercial on television. She gets free clothes in exchange for writing one post a day.

Social media advertising has been adopted by other US-based firms too. Procter and Gamble launched an online ad campaign. The company invites consumers to ask questions about a product. Answers are then broadcast on YouTube.

Although internet advertising is catching on very fast, companies still must be careful with these new methods.

Most people would guess that the selfie was around the beginning of this century or perhaps a bit later when smartphones became mainstream. But most people would be wrong, just as Britney Spears and Paris Hilton were wrong when they declared on Twitter in 2017 that they had invented the selfie eleven years previously. In fact, they were around 167 years too late to make that claim. The oldest existing selfie dates back to 1839 when photographer Robert Cornelius took a self-portrait photograph of himself. To achieve this, he had to uncover the lens, run to his place and pose in the same position for up to fifteen minutes and then run back to cover the lens again. Cornelius couldn't take a dozen shots and choose the best one - his selfie had to be just one photo. Half a century later, in 1914, thirteen-year-old Grand Duchess Anastasia Nikolaevna of Russia took a picture of herself in a mirror and became the first teenager to take a selfie.

The <u>origin</u> of the word 'selfies' is thought to come from Australia where people have a habit of putting -ie on the end of words - barbie for barbecue, postie for postal worker and even Aussie for Australian. In 2002, an Australian man took a photo of an injury to his lip and put it up on a public forum to ask for advice on how to treat it. He referred to the photo as a selfie, and the term was born. Selfie became Oxford Dictionaries' word of the year in 2013.

A 2017 study into 'selfitis', as the obsessive taking of selfies has been called, found a range of motivations, from seeking to feel more part of a group to shaking off depressive thoughts and - of course - capturing a memorable moment. Since we live so much of our lives online, there is pressure to present

good quality images, and so it is no surprise that airbrushing apps that enable people to retouch images and present an idealised version of themselves are gaining popularity.
